The Rotary Club of Fremont partnered with Fremont Ross High School to provide a program called "STRIVE" for 17 high school seniors during the 2015-2016 school year. STRIVE stands for Students Taking a Renewed Interest in the Value of Education. The program goal is to help seniors identify and reach educational and career goals by providing the inspiration, knowledge, and tools they will need to succeed. Students participate in monthly meetings at the school, attend Rotary meetings, and receive support and information from Rotarians who serve as mentors.
